Project Target Area	The indigenous population in 30 villages in the Andong Meas and Ta Veng districts sustainably generates sufficient food and income, has adequate access to water and sanitary facilities and is able to represent and protect their economic and social interests.
Beneficiaries:	The target group represents the indigenous population of 30 villages in the Andong Meas and Ta Veng districts. The number of people in the direct target group amounts to 8,902 in 1,872 families. Beneficiaries are small farming families that belong to various indigenous groups.
Overall target	Poverty alleviation and sustainable improvement of livelihoods of the indigenous population in Ratanakiri province.
